The program takes place at Harvard University and brings together students from around the world to participate in workshops, discussions, and practical activities. Participants will learn from Harvard faculty, public figures, and mentors, gaining skills that are important for leadership today. The program also offers opportunities to explore the historical and cultural landmarks of Cambridge and Boston.



The program also offers students a unique opportunity to visit Harvard University, providing them with a once-in-a-lifetime chance to explore the prestigious campus. Students will acquire the skills needed to develop their leadership abilities, enabling them to create a positive impact on both the school and community.









Objective of the Program

The goal of the Harvard Political Union Young Global Leaders Program is to inspire and prepare participants to become ethical leaders in their fields. The program's objectives include developing an understanding of civic engagement and its importance in democracy, providing practical experience in policy-making, media communication, and advocacy, encouraging ethical decision-making and integrity in leadership roles, and promoting collaboration and networking among a diverse group of future leaders, with a focus on exchanging ideas and developing a global perspective on public service.

Outcomes of the Program

By the end of the Harvard Political Union Young Global Leaders Program, participants will understand how government works and the role of civic engagement. They will gain skills in public speaking, media strategy, policy development, and advocacy, be prepared to handle ethical challenges and make informed decisions in a changing world, build a network of peers and mentors committed to making a positive impact, fostering long-term collaboration and support, and be ready to apply their new knowledge and skills to real-world challenges in their communities.

Possible Outings

Bowling

Location: Kings Dining & Entertainment, Seaport

Kings offers multiple lanes that can accommodate large groups. They have dedicated event spaces that include food and beverage packages tailored for group events. Booking in advance is essential for a group of this size to ensure sufficient lanes and dining space.

Ice Skating

Location: Boston Common Frog Pond (Winter Season)

The Frog Pond in Boston Common is a popular spot for ice skating, offering a picturesque setting in the heart of the city. Renting the rink for a private event is recommended to handle a group of 150, with options available for skate rentals and concessions. The rink typically stays open until 9:00 PM during the winter season.

Museum Visit

Location: Museum of Fine Arts (MFA), Boston

The MFA is one of Boston's premier cultural institutions, offering after-hours private tours and event space. The museum closes to the public at 10:00 PM on select days, making it ideal for an evening visit. Arranging a guided tour followed by a reception in one of the museum's event spaces would provide a structured and enriching experience.

Harvard Tour

Location: Harvard University, Cambridge

A guided walking tour of Harvard Yard offers a historical and educational experience. For large groups, it's advisable to split into smaller sub-groups with multiple guides to enhance the tour experience. Following the tour, the group could enjoy dinner at one of Harvard Square's many restaurants or in a private event space at a local venue.

MIT Tour

Location: Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), Cambridge

Similar to Harvard, MIT offers campus tours that explore its rich history and innovation. For large groups, booking multiple guides is recommended. The tour could be followed by a visit to the MIT Museum, which could be arranged for a private evening event if desired.

Basketball Game

Location: TD Garden, Boston

Attending a Boston Celtics game at TD Garden is a great group activity. Group ticket sales offer blocks of seating together, and catering options can be arranged for a pre-game or in-game meal. Arriving around 7:00 PM allows for settling in and enjoying pre-game activities before the 7:30 PM tip-off.






Terms and Conditions

- 1) The fee covers academic fees during the Winter Camp at Harvard University, stay and meals for 7 nights and 8 days and airport pick-up and drop-off. It does not include air tickets and Visa fees for the program.
- 2) For **Batch 1**, the hotel check-in date would be **5th January 2025** (3:00 PM) and check-out would be **12th January 2025** (12:00 PM). For **Batch 2**, the hotel check-in date would be **12th January 2025** (3:00 PM) and the hotel check-out would be **19th January 2025** (12:00 PM).
- 3) For Batch 1: On January 5th, the fee includes dinner only. From January 6th to the 11th, all three meals breakfast, lunch, and dinner will be covered. On the 12th, only breakfast will be provided.

 For Batch 2: On January 12th, the fee includes dinner only. From January 13th to the 18th, all three meals breakfast, lunch, and dinner will be covered. On the 19th, only breakfast will be provided.
- 4) The fee does not cover airfare, visa charges, or individual expenses like sightseeing, travel on account of personal reasons, and any other expenses not directly related to the Winter Camp.
- 5) In the case of a teacher or guardian accompanying a group of students, they are permitted to drop off the students at the campus. However, classroom access during the program will be limited to the registered participants only.
- 6) Students are responsible for obtaining any necessary visas or permits required to enter and stay in the United States for the entire duration of the Winter Camp, if applicable. It is essential to ensure all visa requirements are fulfilled well in advance of the program start date.







About the Hotel

The upscale Cambria® Hotel Boston Somerville is situated between Somerville's Union and Porter Squares, just over half a mile from Harvard University and less than 2 miles from Tufts University and MIT.

It is also across the street from Somernova, home to Boston Bouldering Project, Aeronaut Brewing, Artisan's Asylum, and Greentown Labs, North America's largest climate technology incubator. Nearby attractions include Assembly Row, Bunker Hill Monument, the USS Constitution, and Encore Casino.






